GENERAL INFORMATION

The Buena Vista University baseball coaches and players will be holding clinics for all ages over winter break.

All school-aged students are eligible for a particular camp that will take place inside the spacious Lamberti Recreation Center at Buena Vista University.

REGISTRATION

Applications will be accepted by mail, fax, or email before Friday, Dec. 9. Players that register late may not receive a t-shirt. Make checks payable to BVU Baseball. Checks will not be cashed until the clinic has taken place, due to the threat of dangerous travel conditions. On the day of the camp, cancellation announcements will be given on KAYL radio (101.7 FM), or you can call 712.749.2298 to hear a voice mail recording. Cancellation of registration by the athlete must be done by phone. Check-in will take place at the front desk of the Lamberti Recreation Center, 30 minutes before each session begins.

OFFENSIVE/DEFENSIVE CLINIC

This camp will be designed for all high school players. The goal of the camp is to learn hitting drills to improve swing techniques that will help maximize power and contact consistency. Players will also be instructed in their primary defensive position (see registration form).

PITCHING CLINIC

This camp will be designed for those pitchers who are interested in improving arm strength, command, endurance, and mechanics. Players will be introduced to appropriate training exercises, pitching strategy, and drills to improve mechanics. Players attending this camp need to bring their glove and wear comfortable workout attire.

K-4TH GRADE CLINIC

This camp will be designed for beginning baseball players. Students will be taught the very basic fundamentals of throwing, fielding, and hitting. All players will learn how to throw, pitch, field, and hit by participating in fun drills and friendly competitive events. Campers will need to bring their own bats and gloves and should be ready to have some fun!

5TH-8TH GRADE CLINIC

This camp will be designed for little league and senior league players, but will still emphasize the mechanics of throwing, pitching, defense, and hitting. Players are encouraged to indicate which position is their primary position (see registration form). Campers will need to bring their own bats and gloves. The goal of this camp is to identify particular drills that will help each individual improve before the upcoming season.

EQUIPMENT

Each player should identify their equipment, as we will not be responsible for lost or stolen articles.

ABOUT BVU BASEBALL

BVU enjoyed another historic season in 2011. After winning the 2010 IIAC Championship, the 2011 team qualified for the Division III World Series for the first time in school history. The Beavers won their first two CWS games before losing to the eventual national champions and runner-up. For the third consecutive season, the Beavers broke the school record for wins in a season, finishing 34-18. BVU finished seventh and 12th in the post-season national polls by D3baseball.com and Collegiate Baseball respectively. It was the second consecutive season BVU has been ranked in the final top 30.

2011 Offensive Highlights: BVU finished second in the IIAC in batting average (.304). The Beavers finished 19th in the nation in hits (511) and ranked 31st in the nation in runs scored (322). BVU set four offensive single-season team records and set three individual single-season records. Three BVU players were named All-Region and five players received All-Conference awards.

2011 Pitching Highlights: For the second consecutive season, BVU had three pitchers named to the All-Conference teams and two were named All-Region. Six individual single-season school records were broken in 2011. Ten different pitchers earned at least one win for the Beavers.

2011 Defensive Highlights: For the second year in a row, a Beaver defensive player earned an All-Region Gold Glove. The team's .953 fielding percentage ranked sixth in school history.
